Taking the LEAD

LEAD Teams are local groups where pastors connect to **Learn**, **Encourage**, **Achieve**, **and Dream** together. In 2024, more than 90 pastors gathered across 22 LEAD Team meetings, strengthening their ministries through collaboration and shared wisdom.

These LEAD Teams featured special speakers, overnight getaways, and plenty of fun. Jason Allison, our Church Strengthening Director, led sessions on Soul Care Essentials at two gatherings. Pastor Darryl Godlock shared best practices for church systems in May at our Virginia gathering, which concluded with dinner and an axethrowing competition!

We are deeply committed to developing the next generation of pastors, planters, and missionaries. In December, Converge pastors participated in the ordination evaluations of Jason Guynes (Grace Point, Newtown, Pennsylvania) and Kyle Hoffsmith (Old North Church, Canfield, Ohio)—both completed their ordination councils.

The need to train more pastors is growing, and local churches are the best place to do it. To further this mission, Converge MidAtlantic leaders attended a two-day training with Leadership Pathway near Cincinnati. Founded by Dave and Kristin Miller, this initiative equips churches to develop future leaders through structured two-year residency programs.

Regional Leaders Strategize Global Missions Growth

On April 16–17, regional presidents, including Brian Weber, met with Converge International leaders to strategize on sending more missionaries and increasing the global effectiveness of our churches.

Converge Expands Deaf Ministry with Hybrid Missionary Assessment

Converge hosted its first fully hybrid Missionary Discovery & Assessment, welcoming both hearing and deaf participants. Seven individuals were recommended to pursue missionary service, reinforcing Converge's leadership in deaf ministry—both in the MidAtlantic region and around the world.

Local Churches Reaching the Nations in Their Own Communities

Missions isn't just across the globe—it's also across the street. Several MidAtlantic churches are engaging their own communities, ministering to international students and refugees. The Rise Community Church, a new congregation near Dayton, Ohio, has welcomed a large influx of Haitian refugees. Pastor Tokunbo Adelekan connected with Haitian churches within the Converge network for guidance. The young congregation responded by meeting practical needs and launching a Creole-language worship service, a powerful reminder that missions work happens both globally and locally.

MidAtlantic Churches Partner with Compassion International

This fall, our missions focus was

Compassion International—an
organization founded by a Converge
pastor serving in 26 countries,
releasing children from poverty in
Jesus' name. Several MidAtlantic
churches hosted Compassion
Sundays, encouraging their
congregations to sponsor
children and be part of this
life-changing mission.

Grace Church: A Wave of Renewal on Lake Erie

Baptism is a powerful declaration of faith, and within the Converge MidAtlantic community, it embodies our mission to start and strengthen churches, make disciples, and advance God's kingdom.

This summer, Grace Church in Erie, Pennsylvania, experienced a profound moment of renewal while hosting its first beach baptism on Lake Erie since the pandemic. Ninety-seven people took this lifechanging step, including 10 individuals who chose to be baptized spontaneously. Among them was a viewer from New York, who felt compelled to drive to Erie and publicly declare their faith after watching the church's broadcast on TV.

Fearless Commitment at Summer Camp

Our 2024 Summer Camp carried the theme "Full Send," inspired by Luke 10:27: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, all your strength, and all your mind, and love your neighbor as yourself." Last summer, camp attendance soared to 322 campers—the highest in 10 years! But even more exciting, 32 campers made first-time decisions to follow Christ—32 lives forever changed!

Winter Camp at Camp Burton brought together 65 campers, 13 staff, and five dedicated volunteers, creating an unforgettable experience even without the usual snow!
